

## Continuity of Learning Spring 2021

In the absence of a child due to Covid 19 the following chart outlines the school's approach to ensuring that the child can continue to learn.

Phase	Home Learning Contingency
Phase 1	Children in <u>all year groups</u> - go to the school website page for self-isolating children: <u>https://www.dukesgateacademy.co.uk/for-parents/remote-learning</u>
Child absent for <b>1-4 days</b> A member of the household has Covid 19 symptoms and you are awaiting a test or test results	Click on your child's year group. Complete the home learning activities set for that week, which may include: • A writing task • Online reading through Reading Planet • White Rose maths materials • Online timetables practice using TT Rock Stars • A Science task • A wider curriculum task • Spellings – Purple Mash • further learning tasks set through Education City SEND children will be guided to appropriate resources in line with their appropriate stage. In <u>Nursery and Reception</u> , the class teacher will send a link to a class Sway page with Letters and Sounds, story time videos and maths activities reflecting the current learning in class. In <u>Years 1-6</u> , for English and Maths the class teacher will stream daily to the isolating pupil and be available to discuss the learning via Teams. Our aim is that the child continues to access curriculum learning equivalent to their peers. The teacher will ensure that the English set for Home Learning aligns with the English lessons in school. The White Rose maths learning vial align with the maths learning happening in school. If the wider curriculum topic covered by the school is the same as those taught by the Oak Academy, children will be directed to this. If the wider curriculum provision does not align, the class teacher will provide alternative learning so the child not able to attend school is learning the same disciplinary knowledge as those in school. 	In <u>Years 1-6, for English and Maths</u> the class teacher will stream daily to the isolating pupil and be available to discuss the learning via Teams. The live stream will be of the teacher and their modelling only- no other pupils will be in view of the camera.
	The process for this will be:
	<ul> <li>Loaning and delivering a Chromebook, with a log in and password to each pupil (if needed)</li> <li>Sending a Teams meeting invite to each pupil's school email account</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Ensuring that every pupil has the necessary details to log in to Office 365 and understands how to access Teams Meetings</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The live stream will be of the teacher and their modelling only</li> <li>The teacher will mute when it is the children's turn to complete independent learning</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The teacher will return to check in on the children's progress</li> </ul>
	Any child who does not attend the live Team meetings will be contacted by a member of staff.

Phase 3	Children in <u>all year groups</u> - Children be set remote learning tasks daily. These will consist of learning tasks linked to the planned curriculum for the year group. There will be a blended approach of teacher modelling videos, live lessons and online learning activities.

The Sway page will include Letters and Sounds, story time videos and maths activities reflecting the current learning on the curriculum and suggestions for wider curriculum activities to support home learning.
